NCOIL CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL ANNUAL MEETING IN LAS VEGAS

The National Conference of Insurance Legislators concluded a successful Annual Meeting at the Paris Hotel on November 17th – 20th. There were 273 attendees, 63 legislators from 23 states, 7 insurance commissioners and 11 departments represented.

"We saw double digit attendance growth compared to 2015" stated Commissioner Considine, NCOIL CEO. "We have grown because we tackle emerging issues without letting them linger, invited highly-rated speakers, created the innovation series, implemented interim conference committee calls and will be rolling out

more interesting things in the new year."

All of the substantive policy committees met in Las Vegas, discussing model laws including asbestos claims model legislation, Towing Act, Identity Protection of minors, amendments to the highly successful Travel Insurance Model, re--adoption of the Structured Settlement Model Act with a few minor adjustments and discussion of flood insurance.

The Executive Committee approved a resolution sponsored by Sen. Jason Rapert (AR) regarding the DOL Fiduciary Rule and federal encroachment that was introduced

NCOIL HAILS PASSAGE OF H.R. 5143

The National Conference of Insurance Legislators hailed the passage of H.R. 5143 in the House of Representatives this week. The bill is awaiting action in the Senate.

"As a Democrat who strongly supports this legislation I was pleased to see a number of members from my party vote for it so it passed on a bipartisan basis" stated Rep. Steve Riggs, (KY), NCOIL President. "I urge even more Democrats to do so in the Senate".

This past September, NCOIL legislators had a DC Education Fly In where seven legislators had over 50 meetings with Members of the House, Senators, committee staff and congressional staff.

"This shows that NCOIL legislators have

been effective in supporting our state based system where insurance laws are written and enforced at the state level" said Commissioner Tom Considine, NCOIL CEO. "NCOIL will take action where needed to ensure state based regulation is not undermined".

Similar legislation of H.R. 5143, introduced by House Financial Services Subcommittee Chairman Blaine Luetkemeyer, the Transparent Insurance Standards Act of 2016, is Senate Bill S.1086. NCOIL is reiterating Congressional support for the state-based system and encouraging consensus before entering negotiations. H.R.5143 also would strengthen the role of the Independent Insurance Expert on the Financial Stability Oversight Council (FSOC).

HOLDMAN CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL YEAR AS PRESIDENT



At the conclusion of the 2016 Annual Meeting, NCOIL President Senator Travis Holdman (IN) automatically moved to the position of Immediate Past President. Under his leadership, NCOIL embarked on a yearlong Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) analysis to examine what is valuable, what needs improvements, where we can grow, where opportunities exist and where there are threats to the organization. NCOIL has already begun in implement some of the changes, including introducing interim committee conference calls, updating the registration process, done outreach to legislators in noncontributing member states and establish a DC Presence with a Congressional education fly-in this past September.

MODEL ACT TO PROTECT MINORS FROM IDENTITY THEFT PASSES NCOIL

At the NCOIL Annual Meeting in Las Vegas, NV this past week the NCOIL Financial Services and Investment Products Committee passed a Model Act sponsored by NCOIL President Rep. Steve Riggs of Kentucky that protects minors from the misuse of their personal financial information by those with the intent to defraud them, by allowing parents and legal guardians to place a security freeze on a minor's credit report.

Previously, in the instance that a parent discovered a breach of their children's identity, Consumer Reporting Agencies told parents they were not authorized to correct the situation. Riggs said, "identity thieves are establishing credit in the names of minor children and ruining their financial records years before they even apply for a credit card."

"As a legislator, and more importantly, a parent, my primary responsibility is to ensure children are protected" said Rep. Riggs. "This act empowers parents and directs the appropriate agencies to ensure children's identities are protected."

Twenty Eight states have passed an act with this or similar language. The Model Act, which was also approved by the NCOIL Executive Committee will be transmitted to all the states for consideration to become law.
