Accumulator Adjustment Programs

- Many chronic disease patients use copay assistance, such as copay cards or manufacturer assistance, to pay for their life-saving medications.
- Copay accumulator programs prevent such assistance from counting towards patient cost-sharing, such as their deductible or annual out-of-pocket maximum.
- Ex:
 - It's the start of a new plan year in January and you are on a biologic with a list price of \$3,000 a month. You use your copay card at the pharmacy and make a regular copayment at the counter. In March, you've reached the limit on your copay assistance. As a result, when you go to refill your prescription, you will owe \$3,000, the full cost of your drug, because the deductible has not yet been paid down.
- Due to these programs, patients may struggle to afford and adhere to their medications as insurers and PBMs seek to shift more cost-sharing responsibility to patients.


Accumulator Adjustment Programs Trends

- AIDS Institute report shows that:
 - In 45 states and the District of Columbia, there is at least one plan with a copay accumulator adjustment policy
 - In 14 states, every plan includes a copay accumulator adjustment policy
 - In 32 states, at least two-thirds of plans include a copay accumulator adjustment policy
 - Only 3 states have fewer than half of plans that include a copay accumulator policy
- MME study of health insurer medical and pharmacy directors:
 - Around 60% of payers strongly agree that CAPs have the potential to shift costs from plans to patients.
 - A majority (54%) of payers agree CAPs could adversely impact patient medication adherence



All Copays Count Coalition Model Language

- "When calculating an enrollee's overall contribution to any out-of-pocket maximum or any cost-sharing requirement under a health plan, a carrier/issuer/insurer or pharmacy benefit manager shall include any amounts paid by the enrollee or paid on behalf of the enrollee by another person."
- Endorsed by coalition partners such as:
